DLA Setting Records!!

DLA is #I among 38 public schools in Dayton for student growth on the most recent state report card! Our attendance for the year is almost 94% which is above the local average. Four years ago the attendance was about 88%. We have reduced the number of tardies per day from 19 to 17 so far this year. Four years ago we averaged about 60 tardies per day. **THANK YOU** for making your child's attendance and promptness so important to your family.

Assessments

State assessments concluded in April and we will take our final i-Ready assessments in mid-May (see calendar of events in this newsletter). We are proud of the effort that our students made throughout the very lengthy state assessment weeks. We need a strong final push by students with our May assessments. Our spring i-Ready assessments will determine how much academic growth our students made during the course of this school year. It is **VERY IMPORTANT** that the students do their best so that we get an accurate picture of how much gain they actually made.

Enrollment

We have re-registered most of our current students, our kindergarten numbers are growing and we have substantial interest from new students wishing to enroll at DLA! If you have not yet re-registered, be sure to do so very soon so you can SAVE YOUR SEAT.....

More than 110 DLA students have registered for our 4 week program this summer. We have space for more students so be sure to get registered SOON! Summer Launch will feature strong math and reading work every day and every Friday we will have a special program for those with good behavior and good attendance.

Our final school day is Wednesday, May 25 and our first day of Summer Launch is Monday, June 6.

after their classroom instruction.


What better way to prepare your child for the upcoming school year? Sign your child up for the Summer Launch program and you will see the difference four weeks of instruction will do for them.



Did you know? Students can experience learning loss when they do not engage in educational activities during the summer months. On average, students lose the equivalent of two months of math and reading skills during the summer months. More than half of the achievement gap between lower and higher-income youth can be explained by unequal access to summer learning opportunities.

This summer, let's work to change that. Together, parents and guardians can help give our children the best foundation for the upcoming school year.

Stay Engaged

Encourage reading all summer long. This will help prevent the "summer slide" and provide benefits that can be see year-round.

Be Creative
