Activity Night >>>

Activity Night is the entry program for all Adventure Central programming. On Monday evenings, participants can drop in to experience a typical AC program. As there is space, participants will be added to the Afterschool or Day Camp programs.

Afterschool >>> 🙎

The afterschool program serves up to 90 youth per day, Monday –Thursday throughout the school year. Youth in grades 1-12 are engaged in hands-on activities from research-based curriculum with highly trained staff. Highlights include inquirybased learning, homework assistance, and discovery hikes.

Day Camp >>>

Day camp provides participants in grades 1st-8th with an active, safe, fun summer. Activities are hands-on, engaging and educational, helping to reduce the "summer brain drain." Highlights include field trips, creek exploration, and an increased focus on literacy and

Overnight Camp >>>

Adventure Central holds a three day, two night overnight camp each summer. Located at a local 4H Camp, this camp provides an opportunity for urban youth to be immersed in a natural environment. Current Program Youth ages 8-13 participate in group activities planned and led by teen camp counselors.

We are committed to providing teens with opportunities for leadership, voice and choice. Through service learning, becoming a camp counselor, or attending trips and conferences, teens can develop leadership skills on their own terms. JET stands for Job Experience and Training. This workforce preparation program gives teens real work experiences in a variety of parks settings. Teens 12 years or older can apply and interview for one

> of 25 positions ranging from parks services to youth education, as well as administrative, and nutrition.

Teens work for eight weeks

throughout the summer and reflect on their experience through journals, group discussion, and an online blog. Applications for this award-winning program become available in February.
